GENERAL INFORMATION

Visit U.S.A. Persons residing more than 100 miles beyond the border of any state in the U.S. may purchase 21 days of air transportation permitting unlimited travel throughout the United States, including Alaska, for \$150.00.

Children between 2 and 21 years of age pay ½ of this amount. Unlimited travel may be via Alaska Airlines and via the majority of local service carriers reaching into every area of the U.S.

Clergy Fares. A minister of religion may travel over all segments of Alaska Airlines' routes at half of the regular fares after purchasing a clergy identification card through the Airlines Clergy Bureau, Sacramento, California, or if in possession of an identification card issued by Bonanza, Central, Frontier or West Coast Airlines. Travel is on a space available basis, however, once travel has commenced, clergy passengers will not be removed at intermediate points.

Fly Now — Pay Later. Alaska Airlines, American Express and Carte Blanche have available a program which allows you to pay for your air transportation in easy monthly installments. For details, consult your nearest Alaska Airlines Office.

FIRST DAY — Kotzebue-Nome

When you leave Anchorage International Airport this morning, your Alaska Airlines Golden Nugget flight will carry you North and West to an Arctic Adventure which will prove to be THE outstanding experience of your visit to the 49th State!

Enroute to Kotzebue this morning, you will fly over glaciers, rivers, and streams by the score and see many, many spectacular mountain peaks.
